

## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Tullytown Borough Council will meet at the Tullytown Borough Building, located at 500 Main Street, Tullytown, PA on Tuesday, March 3, 2020 at 7:00 p.m., and will, at that time, hold a public hearing to inform and obtain public comment prior to taking any action, and if appropriate after the public hearing to vote to adopt, a Resolution for the purpose of determining the will of the electors of Tullytown Borough on a ballot question referendum. The Pennsylvania Borough Code authorizes Tullytown Borough to levy and collect annually a tax not exceeding three (3) mills for the purpose of supporting and making appropriations to fire companies within Tullytown Borough that serve Tullytown Borough. The tax rate cannot exceed three (3) mills unless the question is submitted to the voters of Tullytown Borough in the form of a referendum. The Resolution will direct that an election be held on April 28, 2020 on the question of whether to authorize Tullytown Borough to levy and collect annually a tax not to exceed four (4) mills for the purpose of supporting and making appropriations to fire companies within Tullytown Borough that serve Tullytown Borough.

Upon consideration of public comments and conclusion of the public hearing, the Council may act to adopt the Resolution described above at its regularly scheduled public meeting immediately following the hearing or at another public meeting held thereafter. A complete copy of the proposed Resolution is available for copying and examination by the public at the Tullytown Borough building, 500 Main Street, Tullytown, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, the office of this publication and the Bucks County Law Library, Doylestown, during regular business hours.
